URGO is setting up the new headquarters for its Healthcare division in the heart of Dijon, at the Centre Dauphine, and is investing 46 million euros in Burgundy

Dijon, 19 February 2026 – URGO, a family-owned healthcare group with its roots in Burgundy, is reaffirming its commitment to its historic region with a €43 million investment in Burgundy. This investment comprises €23 million allocated to the acquisition and fit-out of a new headquarters as part of the Dauphine project, in the heart of Dijon city centre, as well as a further €23 million committed in 2025 to the industrial site in Ouges. These investments bring the total amount invested by URGO in the Dijon metropolitan area to €46 million.

A return to Dijon city centre, the Group's historic base

URGO, a family-run business founded in Burgundy, has been based in Dijon since 1880, with its first site located on Rue Petitot, right in the city centre. The Group subsequently expanded across the greater Dijon area, gradually organising its operations around several sites: Chenôve, Chevigny-Saint-Sauveur, Gevrey-Chambertin and Ouges. In total, we have 1,200 employees across these five sites in the Dijon metropolitan area.

This new site at the Centre Dauphine forms part of a renovation project incorporating architectural choices that reflect the local heritage. The façades are inspired by the half-timbered buildings of the historic centre, the colours evoke Burgundian stone, and the glazed tiles are visible from the top floor, which has been converted into a rooftop terrace. The project involved local businesses and craftspeople, helping to promote regional expertise and boost the local economy.

A new working environment for Urgo Healthcare's 270 staff members

This move to the new site involves around 270 employees from the Healthcare division, who are relocating to a central, easily accessible location, in the immediate vicinity of public transport, the railway station and the shops and services in the town centre. This new arrangement also means that the Chenôve campus can be dedicated to Urgo Medical, which specialises in advanced wound healing.

Dauphine and Ouges: complementary and coherent investments

Through these investments, Urgo aims to support local employment and play an active part in the economic growth of the Dijon metropolitan area.

According to Briac Le Lous, Chairman of Urgo Healthcare: *"This return to Dijon city centre is a powerful symbol for URGO, demonstrating our commitment to remaining firmly rooted in our historic region whilst offering our staff a modern and pleasant working environment. We are confident that this new site will help attract new talent to Burgundy. Our investments in Dauphine and Ouges demonstrate our long-term commitment to Burgundy."*
